

STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAMME

The Student exchange programme is an inter-university or inter-departmental non-Erasmus agreement, dedicated to EU and non-EU international students that decide to spend a semester or entire academic year at the University of Pisa.

Who can apply?

Students enrolled to a foreign university that has a bilateral agreement with the University of Pisa.



When to apply?

It is always possible to apply, but in order to follow the courses and to allow the Department to have enough time to process the acceptance letter to the programme, we advise you to send your application:

- before the 31st of May (to attend the I semester or the entire academic year).
- before the 31st of October (to attend the II semester).

Why apply?

With the Exchange Student programme, you have the opportunity to have an experience abroad and study in one of the most ancient and prestigious universities in Italy; you have the possibility to experience another teaching method; you can study new and different disciplines to enrich your university career; you can get credits that can be recognized in your home university.

How does the academic year work?

The academic year is divided into **2 semesters**:

(1) Semester: September – January

Semester: February – July

There are different **exam sessions** through the year:

Session: January - February

Session: June - July

Session: September




What is the CFU?

Each course/activity has a number of Crediti Formativi Universitari (CFU) assigned, which indicate the amount of work ment as frontal lessons and individual study that a student must do to complete the activity.

1 CFU = 1 ECTS


If mobility can be activated choose courses from the academic offer of the University of Pisa:

On the <u>portal Valutami</u>, from the menu on the left, you can select "Syllabi", search the course you are interested in and verify if it is activated, if it is held in the first or second semester, number of credits, professor's name and contacts, programme, books, exams, etc.



Fill the application form you can find attached at the end of the dedicated webpage.

Send to exchange@unipi.it

- -the application form with the properly signed Learning Agreement
- -the statement of exams passed at your home university (Transcript of records)
- -photocopy of an identity document (passport for non-EU students)







If you attend courses in Italian we strongly recommend that you have at least a B1 italian language level unless otherwise stated in the reference agreements.



Candidates accepted will receive an acceptance letter from the academic staff.

If your application is not accepted, you will receive an email.


You must take the acceptance letter to the Italian diplomatic authorities in the country of residence in order to request a study visa (if you are a non-EU student). For further information on visas for Italy:

Click on "Register" and then on "New user Registration".



Insert your Tax Code if you already have one. If you don't have a Tax Code, tick the box "Foreign student without Italian Tax Code".



Click "Forward" to proceed.



Fill in with your personal information.






Put your name and surname as they are reported on the ID you will upload.



If you don't have a Tax Code, double click on "Forward" (the system will calculate it automatically - remember to request the official one, once you are in Italy).

ONLY FOR NON-EU STUDENTS




If you don't have a residency permit, put 30th of June (of the current year) as expiry date, and "Post office receipt" as Type of residency permit.

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Remember to <u>apply for the residency permit</u> within 8 working days from your arrival date in Italy.

Fill in with the information about your residence address (permanent address in your home country).





If you don't have a landline phone number you can type XXXX.




If your permanent address and the current one are the same, click "Yes". If your current address is different (e.g. your address in Italy), click "No".

Fill in with the information about your current home address (address in Italy).






Insert your email address and your phone number, then click "Forward".



Select "Bank Branch", then click "Forward".



Choose your password, then click "Forward".



Check the information you put, then click "Confirm".

We suggest you to save or print the reminder with your personal credentials (username and password).







Students from the above categories <u>only have to follow the registration</u> <u>process up to the creation of a username and a password</u> - then they have to follow their own enrolment procedure (check the links).

Once in Pisa

Apply for the <u>residence permit</u> within 8 working days from your arrival date in Italy (if you are a non-EU student, coming from a NON Schengen Country, and are going to carry out a mobility period of more than 90 days). In case you come from a Schengen Country, please follow instructions at <a href="https://doi.org/10.1001/jhis.1001/



To complete your enrolment, register on the <u>Alice Web Portal</u> of the University of Pisa, entering your personal data, and then email to <u>wis@unipi.it</u> the following documents:

- Copy of identity document (passport for non-EU students)
- Acceptance letter from the receiving Department
- Residence permit or copy of the postal receipt certifying the submission of the residence permit application (only for non-EU citizens being already in Italy)

After the enrollment is completed, candidates already in Italy will receive the student card by mail. To this aim, the Italian address (residence or domicile) should be provided during the registration on the Alice web portal, after the reception of UNIPI credentials to access the personal page.


Set a new password

Once you are officially enrolled (and you have receive your Matricola/Student Number) - remember to set a new password in order to access all the services of the University.

You can do it from the Alice Portal: or at this link.

You have to insert your Tax Code and the email, then you'll receive an email with a link to change the password.

To access the <u>free Wi-Fi provided by the municipality of the city of Pisa</u>, upon first access, register online, fill in the fields, enter the 4-digit PIN which is obtained via SMS. There are hotspots in the whole city.
